

## **Tri-County Council GIS Committee Meeting**

Representatives from the ESRGC, Somerset County, Wicomico County, and the City of Salisbury were present

### **Topics/Discussions:**

General discussion on ArcPro, Software ELA options, Expanded partnerships across the shore, Training opportunities, RMPIF, NextGen911 and emergency services, LiDAR, Storm water mapping, cemetery mapping, MSGIC updates, Imagery and Pictometry updates.

### **Attendee Reports:**

Adam Gibson reported on behalf of Somerset County. He is trying to bring more GIS into the department to help those who need it. Targeting who is most interested and trying to persuade those who are not. He spoke a little about the Ag land preservation program and building of MD's database.

Frank McKenzie and Adam Phipps Dickerson reported on behalf of Wicomico County. They discussed the upcoming hurricane season and the status of emergency services data, collector app for field inspectors, NextGen911, cemetery mapping and data now available on county website, and spatial analysis of apartments and development activity

John O'Brien, Carl Flint, Grace Malcom, and Kendall Hearn reported for the City of Salisbury. The City is upgrading to a high availability network, exploring 3D, launching housing study, and hoping to fund storm water mapping. They also discussed the importance and potential pitfalls with the upcoming FY20 Census Complete Count. The City and Wicomico County are working together on NG911. Also working closely with City Police on crime number reporting, predicting and prevention.

ESRGC representatives each reported on various projects including Critical Area, Delmarva Index, Power Bi, poultry house digitization, lead nursing forward website and career portal, circuit rider program, SU honor center and City of Salisbury collaborative project
